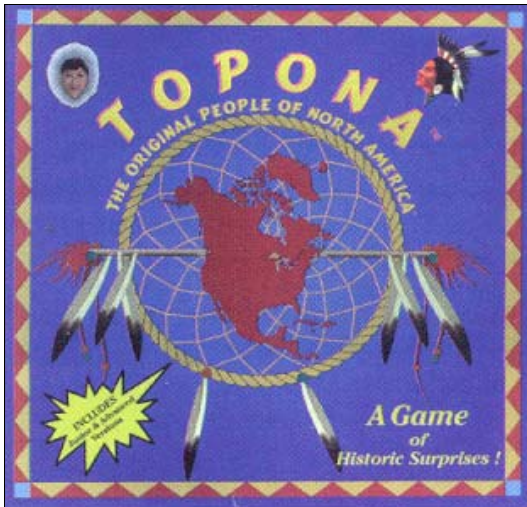


TOPONA™

TOPONA is a game of good news. It has no losers. Players will never be forced to move back spaces. Being wrong may cause you to slow down, but you are always learning.

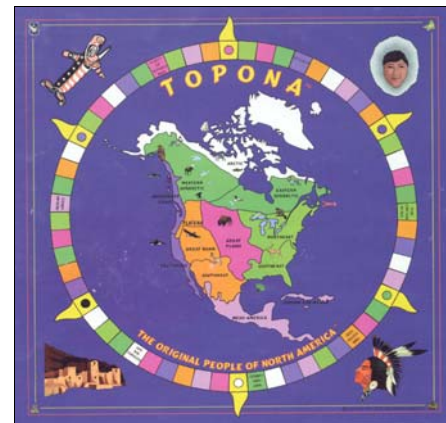
TOPONA is a game of interaction. At any given time, three players are directly involved in the game. If the right situation occurs, everybody can share in the action.
